It's Arborfield Green!

Earlier this year, Crest Nicholson announced the results of a public poll to choose a marketing name for the new community being developed at the former Arborfield Garrison site. You chose "Arborfield Green".

The shortlist of names was drawn from over fifty suggestions that had been submitted by local residents, Parish Councils and other interested groups. Around 9,500 leaflets were circulated locally inviting residents to choose their favourite from the shortlist of five either by postal vote or through a website. Arborfield Green was the runaway winner in the public poll.

Planning permission for the Nine Mile Ride Extension was approved by Wokingham Borough Council's Planning Committee on 15th March, enabling work to start on the construction of the link between the new secondary school and the A327. The new road will also serve the proposed District Centre in due course.



Works in the Pipeline

Over the course of the next six months works will continue at Arborfield Green, focusing on construction of the access road and utilities upgrades to serve the new Secondary School as well as other parts of the development coming forwards. These works will take place along Princess Marina Drive, Biggs Lane and Sheerlands Road and we will do our best to keep disruption to a minimum but should you have any queries or issues please do raise these with us via the usual point of contact at Arborfield@curtinandco.com

Construction of the first new homes at Watermans View, formerly known as Parcel O1, off Biggs Lane is progressing well with the first completions expected in early Autumn this year. We are pleased to confirm that the adjacent parkland, Hazebrook Meadows (see opposite page) will open to the public around the same time.

In addition, Wokingham Borough Council is consulting on the recently submitted detailed planning applications for Parcels A-G and T.

Preserving History

Later in the year Crest Nicholson will be consulting on the Development Brief for the new District Centre and the area around the listed Moat House. Development Briefs are part of the formal planning process and are required under the outline planning permission.





Understandably, there has also been considerable interest in the future of the stables which are a scheduled ancient monument located in the 'Village Green' character area. Over the next year, Crest Nicholson will be protecting and repairing these wonderful buildings whilst liaising with Historic England, the council and a number of other local stakeholders on their refurbishment. We will be formally consulting on the future use of the stables at the appropriate time, but in the meantime we would like to hear any suggestions or ideas you may have for the new use of these important historic buildings. Hazebrook Meadows

• 14 Hectare Park • 2.5 km dog walking paths

A brand new country park known as Hazebrook Meadows is due to open this autumn at Arborfield Green, which includes a wealth of conservation and ecological improvements which are now nearing completion



Hazebrook Meadows will not only provide a wonderland of new habitat for flora and fauna but an exciting parkland for children to explore, as well as footpaths totalling 2.5km for dog walkers or those just wishing to enjoy the open air.

Information and interpretation boards will help visitors to identify the orchids and wild flowers as well as the Red Kites, Owls and Kestrels for whom special nesting boxes have been provided. With several ponds in the park, frogs, newts and toads will be seen in spring with slow worms, relocated from other parts of Arborfield Green, abundant in the summer.

We are conscious that areas of the site previously used for dog walking have not been available for local residents, which has caused frustrations. We hope that the provision of this extensive parkland at such an early stage in the development of Arborfield Green is welcomed by both new and existing residents, and is enjoyed by all.
